Social Distancing

- Avoid close contact with individuals outside of immediate family and circle of friends when possible
- Avoid or leave places where social distancing is not possible (Ex. crowded store or restaurant)
- Respect other business's guidelines (Ex. follow the traffic patterns marked by arrows in the aisles at grocery stores)

Mask Wearing

- Wear face coverings as required by WV Governor's Executive Order (July 6, 2020) when in indoor spaces where social distancing cannot be maintained (Ex. grocery stores, retail stores like Wal-Mart or Target)
- Recognize when it is ok to remove your mask (Ex. take mask off when in private office and socially distanced appropriately)
- Be mindful of others and respect their health and safety by masking



Why Mask?

Wearing a mask to me is not a political statement but about humility, respect for others, and self-respect.

Humility because it's not about me and my "rights," but about respect for others and their right not to be infected by me if I were to have COVID-19, or so that they don't have to worry that I might infect them.

Self-respect because I care enough about myself not to risk becoming infected.

More than anything else today, wearing a mask speaks about our values. We need to be the role models for our communities, ensuring that we maintain our health so we can treat those in need of medical care. Our communities should trust us to be most careful for the most vulnerable among us.
